The HRD concentration is specifically designed for working adults needing to complete a bachelor's degree – five years of full-time work history and 45+ hours of prerequisite courses is minimum requirement for entry. Earning an Associate of Arts degree is recommended following this guide.

TOTAL REQUIRED HOURS FOR AA DEGREE: 62 or 63

A maximum of 68 semester hours will transfer.

Grades of "D" may transfer under the following circumstances:

A grade of "D" may be petitioned through the *Faculty Committee on Admission and Transfer of Credit* in the Office of Admissions located in Hunt Hall. This committee allows **up to 6 hours** to transfer as "general credit" to the U of A. It is up to the College in which the student is enrolled to determine how they will apply this general credit.

If the course the student took falls under the University or College Core category it may be petitioned through the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee in the College of Education and Health Professions beginning in Fall 2004.

If the course the student took falls under program requirements, it may be petitioned through the Academic Department.

Students may come to the Boyer Center for Student Services to pick up a petition.
