This is a two-year, 77 credit-hour program to prepare students to write the national certification examination in radiography.

A grade of "C" or above is required in all science, math courses. There are three criteria (1) overall GPA (2) quality points (3) PSB score.

Admission to the program is highly selective. Approximately 20 are accepted each year.

You must complete the application process at UAFS before applying to the program. You must also complete the Psychological Services Bureau (PSB) Health Occupations Aptitude Examination. Contact the testing center at UAFS (second floor of the student union) to arrange the test. It must be completed and scored by the deadline for application. Call the testing center at UAFS in the fall to find out when the test is available.

The deadline for application is May 15 each year. Spring semester grades must be sent to Lori Jones, Coordinator of Health Science programs at UAFS so that the grades can be plugged in to the matrix for scores to be used for quality points that are a necessary and very important criterion.
