

NWACC begins three new classes this fall

BENTONVILLE – NorthWest Arkansas Community College will begin offering three new classes this fall semester, beginning August 27.

The classes are Oral Interpretation of Literature and two imaginative writing classes, one in fiction and one in poetry.

NWACC's Oral Interpretation of Literature course involves the analysis and oral presentation of various genres of literature including poetry, prose, and drama.

Students will present two performances this fall to the public.

The first will be “Cobber 30,” featuring classic Halloween literature.

At the end of the semester, students will present selections from NWACC's Visions Literary Magazine, which publishes original literary works by NWACC students, faculty, and staff.

Imaginative writing in Fiction is taught by fiction writer Tim McGinn. He has been teaching for more than 20 years. Students will learn how to develop a scene into a short story. Two short stories, approximately 10-15 pages each, will be written during the course of the semester.

Imaginative writing in poetry is taught by poet Curtis Harrell. The class will focus on poetic muse.

Students will write between five and 10 poems, sharing their creations from inspiration to revision through a series of workshops.
