Purpose:

Outcomes:

1. Members of SAGA will be able to articulate their personal leadership style and how to apply it to their position in SAGA.
2. Members of SAGA will be able to define free speech on campus and will be able to effectively articulate that to fellow students.

Assessment Measures:

1. SAGA members will give a presentation and address these questions: 1. What did you learn about your leadership style and how will you use this information to be a leader?
2. Based on what you learned, what does being a leader mean to you?
2. Surveys given to SAGA members to determine the effectiveness of the leadership inventory tool.
3. SAGA members will be given pre/post tests to determine knowledge gain related to free speech.

Standards for Success:

1. Successful presentations will demonstrate new knowledge and understanding of leadership and leadership style.
2. SAGA members will be more confident about their leadership duties.
3. SAGA members will have a greater understanding of the different types of leadership style and with this understanding will be better equipped to work with team members.
4. 100% knowledge gain from pre to post test (Free Speech).
5. SAGA members will be active participants in the Free Expression Protection Team.
6. A SAGA member will be member of the Academic Freedom committee and will be able to articulate free speech as it relates to students.
7. SAGA members will be able to give correct and up to date information to other students as it relates to free speech on campus.

Implementation Plan:

1. Director of Student Life will facilitate leadership inventory with SAGA members at the beginning of the fall semester.
2. Two SAGA members will attend the FIRE Summer Conference in Philadelphia each summer. Those members will train the other SAGA members as well as other student groups.
3. SAGA members will be assigned to committees at the beginning of the fall semester.
