AVSC 290V Internship

Catalog Description

Provides a cooperative work experience for students in the Aviation Management degree option. Cooperative work experience (paid or un-paid) with area aviation employers. Course content is individualized with students setting objectives in consultation with their faculty advisor and their “on-the-job” supervisor. End of course report required. Credit is determined by the number of hours worked by the student.

Target Audience & Transferability

Designed for students majoring in aviation science degree programs. Gives a working knowledge in industry which leads to a degree in Aviation Management. Will transfer to Henderson State University and most other four-year institutions, which offer a Bachelor's in Aviation Management.

Students completing this course will be able to:

1. Demonstrate a working knowledge of facts pertaining to a phase of aviation management.
2. Be fluent in aviation related terminology.
3. Be conversant in industry trends and future challenges.
4. Complete a final report of activities experienced during the internship.

Topics

Internship is designed to expose student to the “real world” of an aspect of aviation management. Student will become familiar with job-related requirements, safety issues, security factors, and business generated pressures.

Required Methods of Instruction

Student must arrange for internship in consultation with the instructor and the proposed internship host. Student must provide own transportation to the site, and conform to host business requirements. Students must provide instructor end of class report summarizing experiences and lessons learned.

Required Forms of Assessment

Final grade will be dependent on progress reports from host business, the end of class report, and a final oral exam with the instructor.
